A Note on Academic Costume

Academic costume comes down from the universities of the Middle Ages. In a day when all students were clerics, the gown and its attached hood served both to keep the student warm in unheated buildings and to identify the particular religious order to which he belonged.

American academic costume of today is based upon an intercollegiate code established in 1895. The gown is generally of black, differing somewhat according to the level of the degree. Some universities have brightly colored gowns although many faculty members prefer to wear the more conventional black. The tassel on the mortar board cap may be of black or of the color indicating the degree, except that a doctor's cap occasionally has a tassel of gold thread.

The major distinguishing characteristic of the gowns are the sleeves, styled in the following fashion: bachelor, long pointed; master, oblong; doctor and specialist, bell shaped. The doctor's gown has velvet collar, and three bars. The specialist's gown differs from a doctor's in that it has no sleeve bars.

The hood is the outstanding feature of the costume. Of black material, it is lined with the colors of the college or university granting the degree and is bordered with the color appropriate to that degree. The degree, and not the department or field, governs the color of the border. Thus the border of a doctor of philosophy hood is always blue for philosophy, regardless of the field of study. The Colorado College hood is lined with gold.

Among institutional colors which may be seen at today's exercises are the following: University of California, gold, blue chevron; Chicago University, maroon; University of Colorado, gold, silver gray chevron; Columbia University, light blue, white chevron; Harvard University, crimson; University of Illinois, dark blue, two orange chevrons; Indiana University, crimson, white chevron; Johns Hopkins University, dark blue, gold chevron; University of Michigan, maize, azure blue chevron; Massachusetts Institute of Technology, bright red, silver gray chevron; Northwestern University, purple, gold chevron; University of Pennsylvania, cardinal, blue chevron; Princeton University, orange, black chevron; Stanford University, cardinal; University of Wisconsin, bright red; Yale University, dark blue.
