Information; When, Why & How you came to Colorado College?

I stopped off on my way, in the Spring of 1925, enroute from Salt Lake City to Springfield, Illinois, and visited Colorado College where I met Dr. Douglas, chairman of the Chemistry Department & Charles Mierow, Acting President of Colorado College. I liked what I saw and heard about Colorado College from them & especially about the Chemistry Department and its facilities. When they told me there would be a vacancy in the Chemistry Faculty the following year, I immediately applied for the vacancy. When I arrived home in Springfield the following week, my appointment to the vacancy was already waiting.

The Otis A. Barnes & Margaret T. Barnes Trust agreement with The Colorado College, dated December 26, 1952, began with one Merit Scholarship Award in 1953, and now supports, as of this date, twelve full tuition Chemistry Scholarships & three Summer Research Programs.
